



## September 2014 Administrator Report

Time is flying and fall is quickly approaching. Our Fair in July went really well, attendance seemed to be down at the fair but once again our booth was well attended and seemed to be a favorite. I did take the first two weeks of August off.

Summer went very quickly and we were not able to complete all of the things I was hoping to get accomplished, however we did turn focus to documenting the project and were able to complete.

I will be ordering trees that MSN and TSN do not have from Siouxland Nursery in South Dakota. Custer County CD is happy with their customer service and the quality of stock. If we have a large amount of trees this year, it will be a much larger production and we will need to prepare for distributing the trees in a different format.
